## 2022 – 2023 Review

<b>Key Objective 1:</b> Continue to improve the quality of education, with a particular focus on the development of early reading and phonics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We introduced a whole new scheme and method of teaching to support our teaching of early reading, including a 3 reads approach and the use of different reading books for different purposes, training all staff in the delivery of the scheme to ensure consistency</li> <li>We continued to ensure high standards of teaching, learning and assessment across the whole curriculum, sharing good practice across the school</li> <li>We updated our planning in science, taking account of new guidance and ensuring substantive and disciplinary knowledge was clear</li> <li>We continued to develop targeted teaching, implementing a new intervention tracker to ensure effective use of additional support</li> <li>We continued to make use of the additional funding from the DfE to implement School-Led tutoring to provide further targeted support for children who needed it</li> </ul>
<b>Key Objective 2:</b> Continue to improve behaviour, attitudes and personal development with a particular focus on positive mental health	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We successfully achieved the Eco Schools 'Green Flag' award with distinction for the second year running, further developing the work of our Eco Council</li> <li>We focused more on promoting positive mental health and well-being for both pupils and adults in school, making use of mental health surveys and implementing support where needed for individuals and groups</li> <li>We continued to promote positive behaviour, attitudes and relationships in all areas of school life through the further promotion of the HEARTS and GROW IT values, introducing a new 'Values' badge for pupils to earn</li> <li>We implemented a new way of sharing achievement of each of our values with parents through parent consultation meeting target sheets</li> </ul>
<b>Key Objective 3:</b> Continue to improve leadership and management to maintain strong shared values, policies and practice at all levels	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We continued to promote effective safeguarding practice, including e-safety</li> <li>We continued to develop the skills of our subject leaders in school, equipping leaders with the skills to promote their subject through a 'deep dive' carried out by Ofsted inspectors</li> <li>We further developed the effective use of resources in school, increasing the capacity for using laptops to support across the curriculum</li> <li>We focused on the effective deployment of the additional adults in school, changing the way some of the support is delivered to improve access to all learning for all children</li> <li>We refurbished our adventure play area and our astro-turf areas to improve our outdoor learning and play spaces</li> </ul>

<b>Key Objective 2:</b> Continue to improve behaviour, attitudes and personal development, with a particular focus on the promotion of active learning behavior through the GROW IT values	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Further develop active learning behaviour, including through the development of outdoor learning focused on the GROW IT values (HEARTS Values to form the focus for 2024-25)</li> <li>Continue to develop the promotion of positive mental health and well-being for both pupils and adults in school, including development of playground buddies as wellbeing ambassadors and the signposting / delivery of parenting courses</li> </ul>
