Which member of staff do buddies work with?

- Teach children to play a wider range of games.
- Help lonely children make more friends.
- Support children to make good choices in the dinner hall
- Most importantly, be available to be a friend to all the other children.

- Empathy
- Patience
- Organisation
- A great sense of fun!
