Describe Scrooge's office.

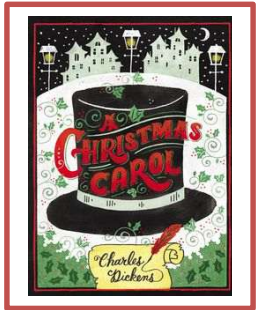


Capture, Sift and Sort
Find out more about figurative language and write a description about the Ghost of Marley.
Use subordinate clauses, adverbs and semi-colons.

Create, Refine and Evaluate
Look at how Scrooge's house and office are similar.
Learn how to evaluate and edit our word choices, making improvements to our writing.

Stimulate and Generate:
Listen/ read Christmas carol, focusing on reading skills inference, predictions.
Drama – prepare first section for Christmas production.

Capture, Sift and Sort

Use relative clauses and possibly semi-colons and a little figurative language.
